## ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

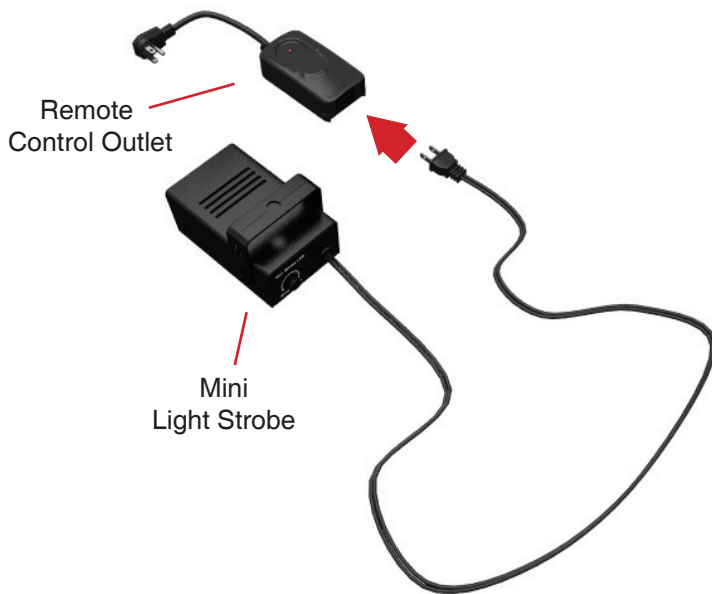

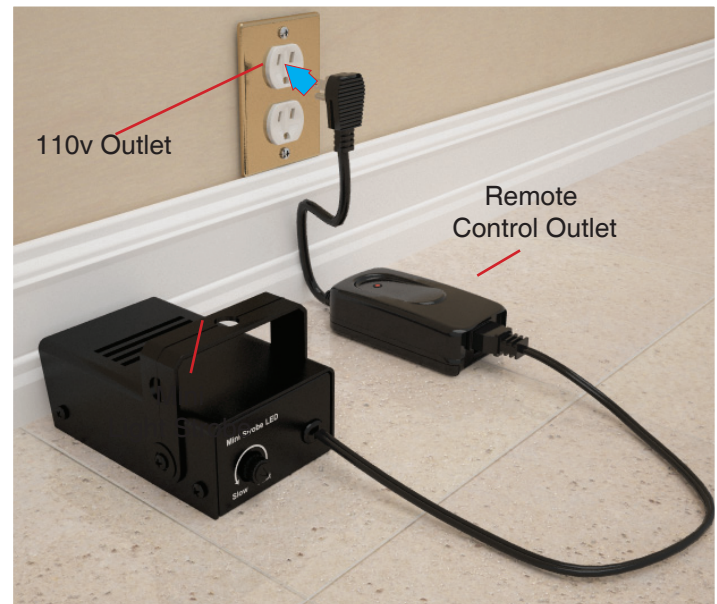

**STEP 1** Plug Mini Strobe Light into Remote Control Outlet.



**STEP 2** Plug Remote Control Outlet into a standard 110v wall outlet.



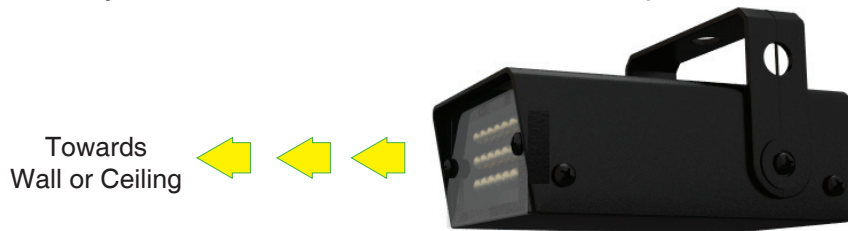
**STEP 3** Test the unit by firmly pressing the “on” button on the Remote Control. The Mini Strobe Light should begin flashing. The Remote Control includes batteries and should work up to 60 feet away.



**STEP 4** Turn Flash Rate knob on back of Mini Strobe Light all the way to the right (clockwise) so the light flashes rapidly. This setting is generally most effective for immediate bird training results. Press the “off” button on the Remote Control to turn off the Mini Strobe Light



**STEP 5** Mount or set the Mini Strobe Light near your bird’s cage, and point the light toward a wall or ceiling near the cage. It is best not to aim the flashing light directly at your bird as this may cause unnecessary stress and could even lead to vision problems if the light is left on for a long period of time.



### Recommended Use:

Whenever your bird screams for attention, firmly press the “on” button on the Remote Control to activate the flashing strobe light for 2-3 seconds, then firmly press and hold the “off” button until the Mini Strobe Light turns off.

### Important Notes:

- Before using this product, always make sure that your bird is not screaming due to pain or danger! This device is only intended to train your bird not to scream for attention.
- Never leave the flashing strobe light on for more than a few seconds. Extended exposure to a flashing strobe light could create a harmfully stressful environment for your bird.
- Be sure to keep all electrical components including wires out of reach of your bird. Do NOT place the Mini Strobe Light inside of the bird cage or within reach of the bird (or other pets).
- If your bird begins showing new signs of stress including plucking feathers, not eating, or sitting at the bottom of the cage, stop using the device and seek attention from a vet as soon as possible.
